# **Executive summary**

## Portfolio Performance

Security selection within emerging markets external debt, an overweight positioning to and security selection within REITs, as well as tactical exposure to securitized products contributed to relative performance over the quarter, while macro strategies and security selection within finance companies detracted.

## Portfolio strategy

We remain selective on generic corporate credit risk and focus on bottom-up security selection, emphasizing resilient issuers with positive rating trajectories and attractive valuations. During the quarter, the Fund selectively added exposure to names in the financial, pharmaceutical, and utility sectors, including via attractively priced deals in the primary market during an active quarter for new issue supply. Conversely, the Fund selectively trimmed its exposure to the technology and tobacco sectors.

All-in yields remain elevated compared to the last 15 years and yields around current levels have historically represented attractive entry points for long-term investors. In this environment, non-cyclicals, select consumer-oriented sectors, defensive BBBs, new issues, and potential rising stars continue to offer attractive opportunities, while ongoing macro volatility and recession risk may lead to downside scenarios in lower quality credits.


# **Fund specific risks**

Risk	Risk Description


# **Quarter in Review**

## Credit spreads ended the first quarter tighter amid improved risk sentiment

Global investment grade credit spreads tightened by 13bps over the quarter to 92bps. Risk sentiment remained robust in Q1'24 while investors delayed and reduced their expectations for rate cuts in 2024 as the BoE, ECB and Federal Reserve held policy rates steady. Meanwhile, in Japan the BoJ raised its policy rate for the first time since 2007, marking the end of negative interest rate policies. Against this backdrop, the Bloomberg Global Aggregate Credit Index outperformed-like duration government bonds by 1.0% over the quarter, with a total return of 0.1% (USD hedged).



On an excess return basis, all regional credit markets posted positive returns during the first quarter as spreads tightened amid improved risk sentiment. The Euro credit market outperformed over the quarter amid improving macroeconomic sentiment in select geographies, partially retracing its underperformance relative to other regions last year.



All rating segments of the global credit market delivered positive excess returns during the first quarter, with lower quality segments outperforming as improved risk sentiment led to further spread compression. That said, the higher-quality segments posted negative total returns as spread tightening was more than offset by the impact of rising rates.

# **Market Summary**

## Security selection and sector allocation contributed to relative performance

Security selection within emerging markets external debt, an overweight positioning to and security selection within REITs, as well as tactical exposure to securitized products contributed to relative performance over the quarter, while macro strategies and security selection within finance companies detracted.

## **Emerging Markets**

Security selection within emerging markets external debt contributed to relative performance, as select overweight issuers outperformed. In particular, select overweight central European corporates benefitted from improved sector-wide operating metrics, while select overweight emerging markets sovereign issuers outperformed amid idiosyncratic improvements in their balance sheet outlooks.


### **REITs**

An overweight to and security selection within REITs contributed to relative performance, as the sector as well as select overweight issuers outperformed the broader market. REIT spreads continued to normalize further versus other corporate credit sectors over the quarter amid stabilizing operating fundamentals, with a select overweight issuer in particular recovering from prior weakness during the fourth quarter of last year.

## **Macro Strategies**

Macro strategies, and in particular curve positioning within EUR and CAD duration, detracted from relative performance over the quarter. Notably, an overweight to the intermediate maturities on the Euro interest rate curve detracted as rates moved higher amid renewed concerns over the impact of continued strong wage growth on the inflation outlook.

## Portfolio Outlook

## Strategic Positioning

Investment grade credit fundamentals have remained resilient thus far as earnings as well as debt leverage metrics have remained relatively stable over recent quarters. Slowing consumer demand and margin pressures continue to represent headwinds for select industries and issuers, and tightening credit conditions remain a downside risk over the cyclical horizon. That said, given strong starting levels, credit fundamentals are generally expected to remain resilient even in a downturn. With respect to valuations, all-in yields remain elevated compared to the last 15 years and yields around current levels have historically represented attractive entry points for long-term investors.

## **Key strategies**

### Top Overweights - Gaming, Airlines, and Lodging

We retain a favourable view of the gaming, airline, and lodging sectors, as continued strength in leisure and business travel as well as strong consumer demand is feeding through to material earnings improvements and de-leveraging potential. Within gaming, we are focused on names well positioned to capitalize on secular tailwinds and growth opportunities. Within airlines, we remain focused on higher quality EETCs (enhanced equipment trust certificates) as well as other secured airline debt.

### **Top Underweights**

We remain underweight issuers with limited upside and potential re-leveraging risk in sectors such as food & beverage and pharmaceuticals. We also maintain an underweight position to sectors with asset-light business models or more shareholder-friendly balance sheet practices such as technology and integrated oil. Similarly, we also take a cautious stance towards issuers in sectors facing secular challenges to their core business models, such as retailers.

### Top Overweights - REITs and Real Estate


While PIMCO acknowledges ongoing risks within the sector, we remain constructive on select real estate and REIT subsectors as we do see pockets of value in the overall sector, which is currently undergoing a deleveraging cycle. The majority of issuers in the portfolio have demonstrated stable operating fundamentals over recent quarters and are expected to be able to continue to navigate the deleveraging phase through rental growth, asset sales, and equity raises. Our preference is for REIT subsectors with secular rental growth drivers, and we focus on issuers with diversified exposures in the industrial, net lease, and hotel segments, while we remain more selective within office REITs.

### **Interest Rate / Currency Strategies**

During the quarter we have continued to dynamically manage the overall duration profile of the portfolio, modestly increasing the size of the underweight position relative to the benchmark. Our positioning now consists of underweights to U.S. and Japanese duration, partially balanced by small overweights to Australian and Euro duration. In terms of currencies, we are currently positioned with tactical long exposures to the Japanese Yen and to a diversified basket of EM currencies, funded by short positions in CAD and EUR.

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Acronyms and definitions of investment terms used throughout the report:

**Alpha** is a measure of performance on a risk-adjusted basis calculated by comparing the volatility (price risk) of a portfolio vs. its risk-adjusted performance to a benchmark index; the excess return relative to the benchmark is alpha.

**Average coupon** is the average of the coupon payments of the underlying bonds within the portfolio.

Average effective maturity is a weighted average of all the maturities of the bonds in a portfolio, computed by weighting each bond's effective maturity by the market value of the security.

"Bend-but-not-break" refers to credits that PIMCO would not expect to default in a credit-stressed environment.

Beta is a measure of price sensitivity to market movements. Market beta is 1.

Breakeven inflation rate (or expectation) is a market-based measure of expected inflation or the difference between the yield of a nominal and an inflation-linked bond of the same maturity.

**Carry** is the rate of interest earned by holding the respective securities.

The terms "cheap" and "rich" as used herein generally refer to a security or asset class that is deemed to be substantially under- or overpriced compared to both its historical average as well as to the investment manager's future expectations. **CPI** is the Consumer Price Index.

The **credit quality** of a particular security or group of securities does not ensure the stability or safety of an overall portfolio. **Dividend yield** is represented by the weighted average coupon divided by the weighted average price.

**Duration** is the measure of a bond's price sensitivity to interest rates and is expressed in years.

Effective duration is the duration for a bond with an embedded option when the value is calculated to include the expected change in cash flow caused by the option as interest rates change.

**Forward curve** is a function graph that defines the prices at which a contract for future delivery or payment can be concluded today.

Fallen angel is a bond that was initially given an investment grade rating but has since been reduced to below investment grade status.

GFC is the Global Financial Crisis.

Information ratio is a ratio of portfolio returns above the returns of a benchmark to the volatility of those returns.

Like-duration Securities are calculated by the index provider by comparing the index return to a hypothetical matched position in the security.

LNG is Liquefied Natural Gas.

The **Option Adjusted Spread (OAS)** measures the spread over a variety of possible interest rate paths. A security's OAS is the average return an investor will earn over Treasury returns, taking all possible future interest rate scenarios into account. The OAS is the net spread over the swap curve that will on average be earned if the security is held to maturity.

Rising star is the term given to a bond that was rated high yield but has since been upgraded to investment grade.

"Risk assets" are any financial security or instrument that are likely to fluctuate in price.

Risk premia is the return in excess of the risk-free rate of return an investment is expected to yield.

Roll yield is the yield that a futures investor captures as their long position in a futures contract converges to the spot price.

"Safe haven" is an investment that is expected to retain or increase in value during times of market turbulence.

"Safe Spread" is defined as sectors that we believe are most likely to withstand the vicissitudes of a wide range of possible economic scenarios. All investments contain risk and may lose value.

The **SEC yield** is an annualized yield based on the most recent 30 day period. The subsidized yield includes contractual expense reimbursements and it would be lower without those reimbursements. The **Unsubsidized 30 day SEC Yield** excludes contractual expense reimbursements.

Tracking error measures the dispersion or volatility of excess returns relative to a benchmark.

To relate the price sensitivity of ILBs to changes in nominal yields, yield beta is applied to nominal changes to arrive at a price sensitivity of ILBs to changes in nominal rates. A **yield beta** of 0.90 implies that if nominal yields move 100 basis points, real yields will move 90 basis points. ILBs with long maturity may respond differently to changes in nominal rates than shorter maturity ILBs.

The distribution yield for monthly paying Funds is calculated by annualizing actual dividends distributed for the monthly period ended on the date shown and dividing by the net asset value on the last business day for the same period. The distribution yield for quarterly paying Funds is calculated by taking the average of the prior four quarterly distribution yields. The quarterly distribution yields are calculated by annualizing actual dividends distributed for the quarterly period ended on the most recent quarterly distribution date and dividing by the net asset value for the same date. The yield does not include long- or short-term capital gains distributions.
